

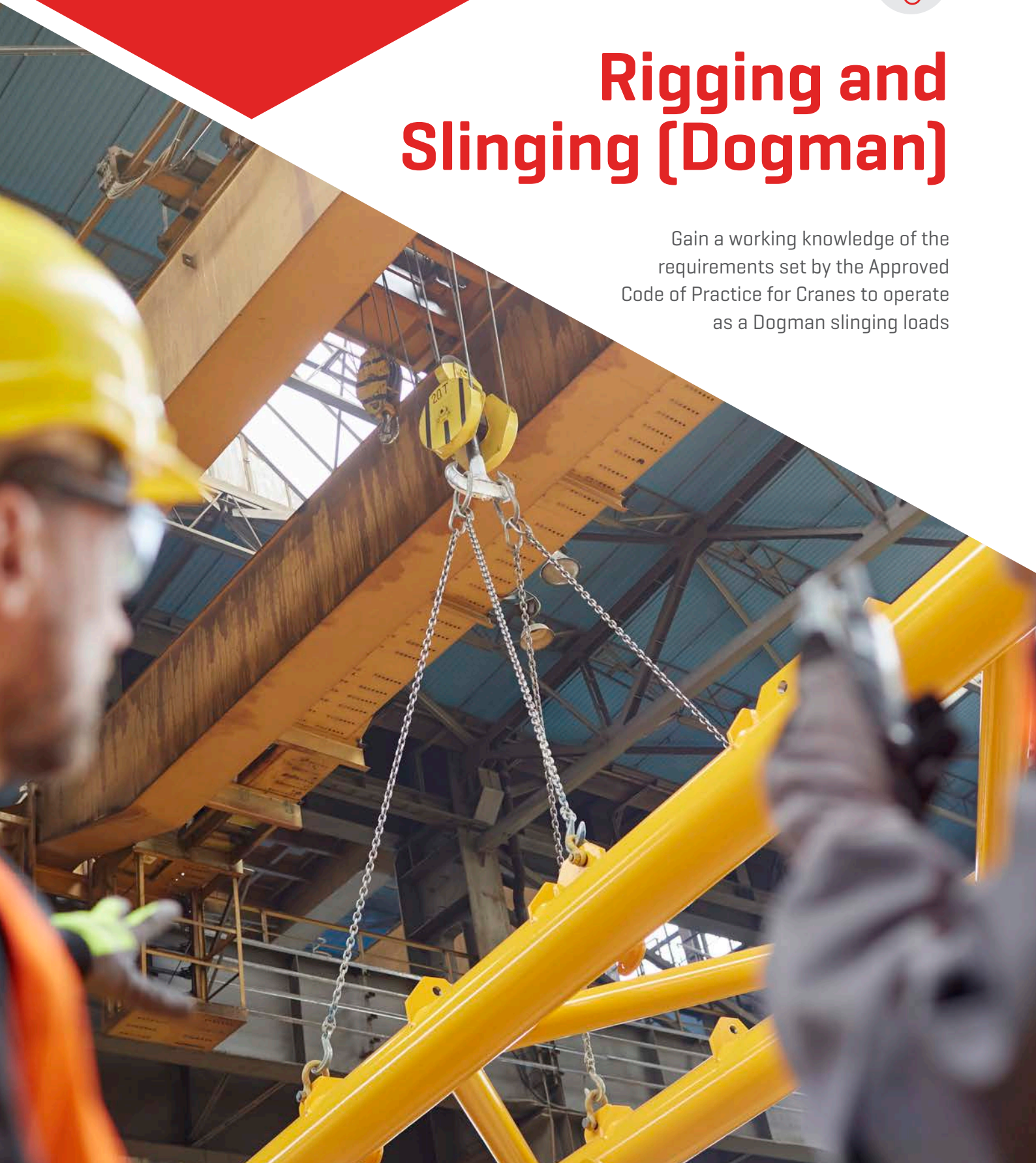

Rigging and Slinging (Dogman)

Gain a working knowledge of the requirements set by the Approved Code of Practice for Cranes to operate as a Dogman slinging loads





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This course has been specifically designed for people who require a working knowledge of crane operations that involve lifting varied regular loads and safely directing cranes during operations. Gain a clear understanding of Dogman responsibilities and the skills needed for carrying out required duties, as well as learning about relevant regulations and general information around the crane industry as a whole.
